God chose his faithful servant Joshua, to succeed Moses as leader of the children of Israel on their journey to the promised land. It was the faithfulness of Joshua that was so pleasing to the Lord. Faithfulness to our God is that which he desires of his people today as well. We are reminded of this in the holy scriptures, reading, "But without faith it is impossible to please him; for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is the rewarder of them that diligently seek him."
