In These Changing Times

"But of the times and seasons, brethren, ye have no need that I write unto you. For yourselves know that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night. 1 Thess.5:1-2 In these verses the Apostle Paul reminds us that we should be well aware of both the time and season we are living in. Truly this is a sobering reminder for all of us. We live in a day when God's word is under assault. It is categorically rejected by many and altered and reprinted by others to make it more appealing to man's mind. The eternal truths of the scriptures are commonly replaced in our day with theory. Satan is there to delude the heart. Thus the matters of eternal life and death so often become secondary or even scuttled completely. Anything that entertains seems to occupy one's thoughts and time, leaving little or no time to study the scriptures; one of the most reliable being the authorized King James version of the Bible. We are all guilty in some measure of such behavior. Again, the Apostle writes how men will be, "lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God." 2Tim.3:4 He continues by warning that those whose hearts are caught up by such things may even have a form of Godliness but deny the power thereof. From such, he counsels; turn away. All of this style of life and more is before us today. Will we stand apart from such ungodliness? Dear friend, flee from the unrighteous works of men in these changing times. In prayer seek God's help to abide in the truth. He hears the prayers of his children and he will give us strength to resist the temptation of our human nature. To simply go along with the flow of humanity is to journey toward spiritual shipwreck and the impending eternal loss of our soul. In 1Thess.5:3-6 the Apostle Paul further warns, "For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape." Then he again reminds the believer, "But ye brethren, are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief. Ye are all the children of light, and the children of the day: we are not of the night, nor of darkness. Therefore let us not sleep, as do others: but let us watch and be sober."

In these entreating words of the Apostle we have recognized solemn warnings and also words of comfort. What might we glean for ourselves from all of this? Simply put, we are reminded, as God's children, that we have a heaven to gain and a hell to shun. We cannot court the unrighteous works of darkness, walking in the ways of this world and also walk as a child of God. One cannot
