

CHRISTMAS: GOD’S LOVE and GRACE

Once again we, as Christians, look forward with joyful hearts to celebrate the events that bring such happiness, especially to believers, at Christmas. Once again, we are reminded of God’s great love and grace extended to all of mankind. This is indeed the true meaning of Christmas. The most commonly accepted definition for the word “grace”, when describing God’s grace, is that it is the unmerited favor of God. God’s graces, like his love, are immeasurable gifts to all. We have much reason to rejoice in this knowledge. Surely if our hearts were unencumbered with our humanness, spontaneous rejoicing would burst forth from within. We can truly say with the song writer, “Tis Grace hath brought me safe thus far and grace will lead me home.” There in the land where the righteous dwell we will one day rejoice eternally when we fully comprehend that His grace has been greater than all our sins.

Be encouraged by these few words dear child of God and continue to press on. Even though your journey here often becomes so wearisome and it seems your footsteps grow heavy, though you may feel like a failure and you are many times discouraged, prayerfully press on. We cannot give up. We’re going home. I especially want to encourage you dear aged brother and sister in Christ, you who so often struggle with aches and pains and many other afflictions of the body in addition to your spiritual warfare, hold fast. The enemy of the soul (the devil) wages a vicious warfare against you and assails you with many doubts and fears but remember, dear child of God, you are never alone. Jesus cares and gives strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow. Today, even in these troublesome times He tenderly invites you to lean more heavily upon the traveling staff of his wondrous grace and love. *“Soon he will come who has promised and his reward is with him.” Rev. 22:12*

May God, our dear Heavenly Father, remind us all that Christ and our faith in Him makes the eternal Christmas ours.
